

Stanza III.




This makes the Web of Athena an apt representation of the mental plane, with the central seven-pointed star representing the threshold between the lower four and upper three subplanes.







The Web of Athena accurately illustrates two types of pyramids both in an orthogonic side view and in perspective.








Pyramid means "fire in the middle", which seems to be illustrated by the location of the innermost seven-pointed star in relation to the 3d pyramidal outline.















